The Celebrant invites all children to come to the altar.

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant It is truly right, and good and joyful,
to give you thanks, all-holy God,
source of life and fountain of mercy.

You have filled us and all creation with your blessing
and fed us with your constant love;
you have redeemed us in Jesus Christ
and knit us into one body.

Through your Spirit you replenish us
and call us to fullness of life.

Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels
and with the faithful of every generation,
we lift our voices with all creation as we sing:

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

Sung twice by all.

Ho - ly, ho - ly, ho - ly, my heart, my heart a - dores you! My
heart is glad to say the words: you are ho - ly, Lord.

Celebrant Blessed are you, gracious God,
creator of the universe and giver of life.
You formed us in your own image
and called us to dwell in your infinite love.
You gave the world into our care
that we might be your faithful stewards
and show forth your bountiful grace.

We failed to honor your image
in one another and in ourselves;
we would not see your goodness
in the world around us.
Yet you never ceased to care for us,
and prepared the way of salvation for all people.

In the fullness of time,
you sent your eternal Word,
made mortal flesh in Jesus.
Born into the human family,
and dwelling among us,
he revealed your glory.
Giving himself freely to death on the cross,
he triumphed over evil,
opening the way of freedom and life.

**At the following words concerning the bread,
the Celebrant is to hold it, or lay a hand upon it.**

On the night before he died for us,
Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread,
and when he had given thanks to you,
he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said:
“Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me.”

**At the following words concerning the cup,
the Celebrant is to hold or place a hand upon the cup
and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.**

As supper was ending,
Jesus took the cup of wine,
and when he had given thanks,
he gave it to them, and said:
“Drink this, all of you:
This is my Blood of the new Covenant,
which is poured out for you and for all
for the forgiveness of sins.

Whenever you drink it,
do this for the remembrance of me.”

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

Celebrant Remembering the death and resurrection
of Jesus Christ,
we now present to you from your creation
this bread and this wine.
By your Holy Spirit may they be for us
the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ.
Grant that we who share these gifts
may be filled with the Holy Spirit
and live as Christ’s Body in the world.
Bring us into the everlasting heritage
of your daughters and sons,
that with [_____ and] all your saints,
past, present, and yet to come,
we may praise your Name for ever.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
to you be honor, glory, and praise,
for ever and ever.

All AMEN.

Celebrant As our Savior Christ has taught us, we now pray,
All Our Father in heaven,
 hallowed be your Name,
 your kingdom come,
 your will be done,
 on earth as in heaven.
 Give us today our daily bread.
 Forgive us our sins
 as we forgive those
 who sin against us.
 Save us from the time of trial,
 and deliver us from evil.
 For the kingdom, the power,
 and the glory are yours,
 now and for ever. Amen.

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread.

Celebrant Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

People Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

Celebrant The Gifts of God for the People of God.

**The Celebrant and Deacon receive the Sacrament in both kinds,
 and then immediately deliver it to the People.**

The Bread and the Cup are given to the communicants with these words

Celebrant The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven.

People [Amen.]

Celebrant The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation.

People [Amen.]

If the consecrated Bread or Wine does not suffice for the number of communicants, the Celebrant is to return to the Holy Table, and consecrate more of either or both, by saying

Celebrant Hear us, O heavenly Father,
and with your Word and Holy Spirit
bless and sanctify this bread (wine) that it, also,
may be the Sacrament of the precious Body (Blood)
of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord,
who took bread (the cup) and said,
“This is my Body (Blood).”
Amen.

**The Celebrant moves to the sedilia
for the singing of the Communion Hymn.**

POST-COMMUNION PRAYER (Bulletin p. 13)

The Celebrant stands at the altar. The People stand.

Celebrant Let us pray.

All God of abundance,
you have fed us
with the bread of life and cup of salvation;
you have united us
with Christ and one another;
and you have made us one
with all your people in heaven and on earth.

that we may proclaim
your redeeming love to the world
and continue for ever
